THE GARDEN UPDATE


Michael Pollan advises us to "Eat food. Not too much. Mostly plants". This is basically a return to an old way of eating – the way our grandmother's ate – from the garden, free of pesticides, locally-grown, and in season. And, it was better tasting, too.

Here at Fox Garden, Farragut's own purist experiment in local organic farming, the garden has been buzzing with activity lately. Using the new PTA-funded Growing Great curriculum, Mrs. Harter's 2nd graders planted a salad garden to learn about vegetable "cousins". Ms. Morgan's 3rd graders and Mrs. Robert's 5th graders planted two beds of winter vegetables including cabbage, spinach, brussels sprouts, and turnips. The 5th graders experimented by surrounded their entire bed with marigolds to test whether the flowers actually can help ward-off pests. And, most recently Ms. Wilkens' 1st graders learned about plant parts, planted lots of carrots and peas, and very significantly, got to pick and eat some fully grown carrots that just happened to be ready! Talk about instant gratification!

To help keep it all alive, our new state-of-the-art irrigation system now includes 6 beds plumbed with drip tubing which will cut our water consumption down by about 70%, and eliminate the overspray which caused weeds in the pathways and encouraged mildew on the plants.

As the garden continues to thrive, we've started to see a few dozen regulars ("garden groupies") who run over every time they see us out there during recess. They tell us about the caterpillars and Monarch butterflies that they just saw, ask about the giant dipper gourd (it's in the art room posing for drawings), they eat lettuce leaves and basil, and dare us to feed them jalapeños, and, if it's hot, they beg us to mist them with water.

So, apparently, this garden is really having a direct impact on our kids. They are discovering the simple pleasures of growing and eating from a garden. They see the hard work of weeding, and smell the compost cooking. Some are even getting to yank out carrots from the earth, rinse them, and then munch them on the spot. Oh, and also, wave them around like daggers... 'cause that's cool too.

So, with this in mind, I went searching for Mrs. Eskridge who, among about a million other things she does at our school, oversees the student council. She was, as one would expect, a wealth of information. However, I did not get a picture. So, hopefully I can secure one to run in a future newsletter.

Near the start of school, 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade classrooms each select 3 representatives. The students in 3rd-5th grades vote for the president and all officers. The students who were running each gave a speech to all the students and then each class received ballots and voted in their class.

The Student Council focus on running Spirit Days and earning money to purchase balls and jump ropes for the playground. They are also involved in service projects, such as monthly food drives, Christmas gifts for the families at Family Place, and act as Hall Monitors during lunchtime.





Principal Carroll's Corner....

Parent conferences are coming up this month and at the parent conference you will receive your child's report card. Your child's teacher will explain the grading and provide you with suggestions on how you can support learning at home. Our goal is for all students to reach proficient in English Language Arts and Math. We are very fortunate to have such a wonderful, caring parent community that values education and encourages their children to put forth their best effort at school.

One significant way parents can help their children is by making time each evening to work on memorization of math facts. Students in third grade and up are expected to know all of their multiplication tables with automaticity. That means the child can effortlessly give the product for each multiplication fact. Selecting just a couple of math facts to work on each day and committing them to memory will result in your child soon knowing all of the facts. When my children were in elementary school, we would recite math facts in the car on the way to school or to the grocery store. If your child doesn't have their math facts mastered, math will become frustrating to them as they are required to do long multiplication and division problems, find common denominators, etc. One way to ensure that your child does well in math is by helping them commit the math facts to memory.

Due to the December parent conferences, students will be dismissed at 1:45 December 6th thought December 14th. Wednesday, December 15th will be a regular day with dismissal at 3:15. The day before Winter Break, Friday, December 17 with be a short day with students dismissed at 1:45. Please mark your calendars.

IF YOU'RE NOT SIGNED UP FOR THIS, YOU SHOULD BE

eSCRIPT.COM

The eScrip program is a fundraising program that allows participating merchants to contribute a percentage of your grocery loyalty cards, credit card, and debit/ATM card purchases to the school or organization of your choice (i.e. Farragut Elementary).

Expenditures can be for food, clothing, travel and entertainment, as well as miscellaneous family purchases. AND, keep in mind that with the eScrip program, extended family and friends who live in and out of town can also participate, supporting your worthwhile programs.

Here's How it Works

- You register any one or all of your existing grocery loyalty, debit and credit cards for use in the program.
- Participating merchants will make contributions to your chosen group, based on purchases made by you, just by using the cards you have registered.
- Your purchases are tracked and available to you online, allowing you to see just how much you are earning on your child's behalf!

ESI introduced the eScrip program in 1999 and has distributed over \$250 million to schools and youth organizations across the country.

PTA & FAN CLUB NOVEMBER MEETING NOTES:

On the subject of classrooms raising independent funds for purchasing larger classroom items for teachers that can be received and used immediately, Steve Levin commented that this effort is building a legacy school infrastructure and setting a new tradition in outfitting the classrooms. One member reminded parents that it is important to ask teachers what they want in their classrooms. To-date, 6 document readers have been purchased this year through independent parent donations. Kudos to those parents who donated and to the head room parents for coordinating these efforts!

After a lively discussion, members was voted to pay the Successmaker annual maintenance fee for the coming year. This provides technical support and includes any software upgrades that become available. Parents are anxious to see results after students have worked with the software a full year.

Bridget VanSlyke reported on the overwhelming success of the Reflections workshops.

An update was given on the Bicycle Safety Course which will be held at the school a weekend just after the students return from Winter Break.

Although there was no Teacher Report at this meeting, we would love to have teachers attend PTA/Fan Club meetings and report their views. PTA & Fan Club are a parent/teacher support groups and having active teacher participation in meetings will help keep our efforts targeted and meaningful.

Steve Levin reminded the group that the 2nd and final installment on the Successmaker purchase is due in December and any donations above the annual per student donations are welcomed. The final payment is approximately \$22,000.

December 14 is the next PTA/Fan Club meeting in the school library starting at 6:30pm. Pizza, snacks & childcare provided.

The PTA's Family Portrait Fundraiser raised \$1100.00 for the school.

Many thanks to Casper Brindle for generously donating his time for this event.

A reminder that, if you haven't already, pick up your disk (if you ordered one in your picture package) in the school office.

The first-ever Farragut Elementary Rummage Sale made \$1200.00.

Not bad for a short day's work. Proceeds will be used to fund Farragut 5th grade activities.

Thanks to all the hours Brian Kasch and his crew put into planning and to all the families who donated items and came out to help on the day of the sale.
